FVMA Leases New Office Space to Open in February 2026

On November 1st, 2025 we signed a lease agreement for a small 530 sq. ft. office space located on Montrose Ave. in Abbotsford, directly on bus routes. We are very excited to hold regular programming at this location, to have a space to hold board meetings, and to complete administrative duties and event planning. We are working hard to complete renovations to see the center open up by February. It might be small but we are not limited to this space. For larger community events, we will find appropriate facilities to gather.

We are planning to hold an open house for our new location, the date is still to be determined, but we are aiming for early February. Once the renovations are complete we will be able to let our community visit and see the hard work we've put in to bring our new centre to life. We are seeking a licensed **plumber** to help us with the last steps. We are hoping there is one within our community. If this is you, please connect with us. We are looking for estimates!

WHAT WE'VE BEEN UP TO SO FAR

BigFoot Moccasin

A few Board directors attended the Louis Riel Day Event at Fort Langley. We took scraps of leather, jewelry findings, cabochons, beads, and more. We had a successful sale earning more than \$1000 in sales. This also resulted in another large sale being made for small medicine pouch kits for nearly \$3000. This is very helpful in offsetting our storage costs for the inventory acquired with BigFoot Moccasin. We are planning to sell some more of the inventory at future events, at the new office, and directly to community members.

The Bigfoot Moccasin inventory generally consist of:

- drum frames
- cabochons
- synthetic sinew
- beading needles
- beading thread
- raw hide chunks and scraps
- beads of various sizes
- jewelry findings
- beading tools
- rabbit furs
- Suede scraps and sheets
- industrial sewing machines
- leather cutting machines and templates
- bead looms
- FVMA t-shirts
- small medicine pouch kits
- sage smudges

Climate Change & Marine Ecosystems Tour



Hands-on Habitat Restoration Volunteer Opportunity for Youth

Vedder River Restoration, Youth-Led Action for Freshwater Health will provide **youth aged 16-25** in the Fraser Valley with an opportunity to participate in the stewardship of the Vedder River, a watershed that holds significant cultural, environmental, and recreational values. This project will empower youth with practical skills and leadership in sustainability, while monitoring and improving freshwater quality and habitat for salmon and other native species along the Vedder River in Chilliwack. Youth will learn about both Indigenous and western approaches to ecosystem health, get exposed to different career pathways within restoration and sustainability, and learn how to use creative storytelling to encourage the broader community to do their part in ensuring freshwater health.


